Current Grading System

Effective September 1, 1980 the In Progress grade was established "IP"

Effective September 5, 1977, the following grading system was established:

A/A-/B+/B/B-/C+/C/C-/NC	I - Incomplete
P/NC	NI - Not In
W - Withdrew Passing	Y - Excused
X - Withdrew Failing	Z - Audit

Course Credit System: Effective September 1, 1970, a course credit of "one unit" is given as a credit equivalent to 3.5 semester hours or 5.25 quarter hours.

Summer School: Effective June 13, 1977, course credit will be recorded as "one unit" equivalent to 3.5 semester hours or 5.25 quarter hours. Prior to June 13, 1977, summer credit was recorded as semester hours.

To be graduated a student must receive a grade of C- (or P) or better for a minimum of 34 units of course work. The P grade represents work of at least C- or better.

Prior to September 1, 1975: NC (No Credit) grades were expunged from the student's record if the courses were repeated with a passing grade. NC (No Credit) grades are no longer expunged from the student's record.

\*High Pass grade consideration indicated by an S following the course description marks a course as being taken for the high bracket of the overall CR (Credit) grade. The grade option was reserved for Juniors and Seniors in their major and where applicable preprofessional fields.

Prior to September 1969, the following grading system was used:

A - Excellent - 4 Quality Points	I - Incomplete
B - Good - 3 Quality Points	N - No Credit
C - Average - 2 Quality Points	S - Satisfactory
D - Passing - 1 Quality Point	U - Unsatisfactory
F - Failing - 0 Quality Points	W - Withdrew Passing
P - Passing* - 0 Quality Points	X - Withdrew Failing

\*The special designation of "X" following the course description marks a course as being taken under the Pass/Fail Option.

Graduate Credit: The College provides an optional grading track for graduate classes. "G" designates letter grades and "P" designates Pass/Fail.
